Lanhydrock class have been busy making Tomato & Basil soup outside in the glorious weather and practicing Midsummer Night's Dream.





## **Caerhays Class News**







This half term in English, pupils in Caerhays have been writing about their hobbies, how to write a formal letter which followed on with writing a persuasive letter, and different types of newspapers and writing a newspaper report. In Maths we have looked at compass directions and how to follow them, weight, volume and capacity and multiplication. In Science we have been completing online learning using BBC Bite size and a range of sensory practical activities from The Sensory Nature Hub.

In Humanities and Food Technology we have been looking at other cultures — each week studying a different country and cooking their traditional food. We have studied Italy, France, Spain, Japan, Thailand, Greece, America and Germany. The pupils have enjoyed tasting new foods and learning about the specific cultures.

Our afternoons have included lots of practical activities such as Geocaching, walks by the river, biking and enjoying being outside in the fresh air.

We have started doing a lot of gardening this term and pupils have planted lots of different plants, fruits and vegetables and built raised planters for when the plants are ready to be planted outside. Some of these we have sold to members of staff and then some pupils visited a garden centre to buy more seeds to plant. We have planted garden peas, spinach, beetroot, courgettes, sweet peas, strawberries, basil, spring onions and a whole host of other vegetables and we still have lots more to plant after spending our proceeds at the garden centre.

In Forest School we have been looking at fire safety and cooking around the fire, foraging for what we cook, natural den building — a robin has actually made a nest in the den and we have been able to watch them come and go whilst feeding their babies. We have made garlic dough balls having foraged for the garlic, s'mores and cooked sausages.

Finally, in PE we have been using the fitness equipment and each morning we do a session in the gym.






























### TRERICE CLASS NEWS

Although we were a little naughty last week and gave into our sweet tooth by baking fairy cakes, the focus in cooking this half term has been on independent living skills and preparing for adulthood. From macaroni cheese to tuna and sweetcorn pasta bake, Trerice has been making simple pasta dishes that might one day become part of their meal repertoire.





The theme for the summer term is 'Back to the 60s' and the pupils of Trerice have started their creative journey by looking at genre and how musical theatre styles have changed over time. Having made comparisons between the three film versions of Oliver Twist, pupils now bring their focus back to the 1968 film *Oliver!* 

I have tasked Trerice with creating their own performance piece using *Oliver as* stimulus, but with the added challenge of switching genres. 
# **Trebah Class News**


### MyMaths
